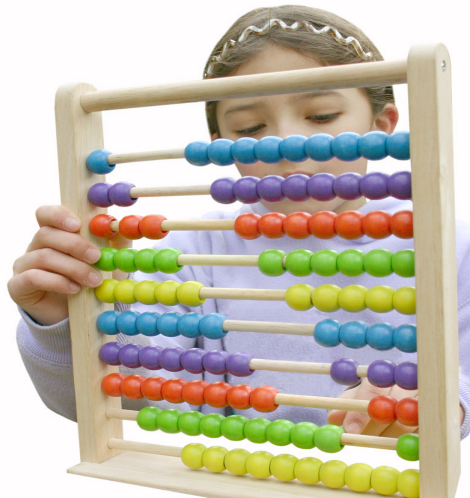

English

The children will be involved in the following literacy activities.

- Developing knowledge of long and short vowel sounds, 'wh', 'ay' and 'ea' sounds.
- Developing knowledge of alphabetical order and using simple dictionaries.
- Developing an awareness of initial consonant blends for reading and writing.
- Developing an understanding of sentences in reading and writing.
- Developing an understanding of common nouns and proper nouns, verbs and conjugating verbs, past tense, doubling rule and future tense.
- Learning to read and write regular and 'tricky' words.
- Using rhymes and patterned stories as models for own writing.
- Writing lists.
- Writing about their own experiences.
- Recount a story in booklet form.
- Looking at important events in a story.
- Questions and answers.
- Writing a report.
